

- The 2024 Budget reflects the County's commitment to making appropriate investments in the core services that our residents rely on, while also considering the reality that our taxpayers are facing increased costs of living from provincial and federal policy decisions
- A tax rate increase of 5.51% means that for the value of a residential property, taxes would increase by \$23.77 per \$100,000 of the value of the property according to its MPAC assessment
 - Homeowners with an assessed value of \$303,000, the median assessed value in Middlesex County, would see an increase of \$72.00 per year on the County portion of their tax bill



Social Services

- Investments in childcare and EarlyON programs and services that supports more child and family visits
- Collaboration with the City of London to update the Homeless Prevention and Housing Plan as required by the Province

Middlesex-London Paramedic Service (MLPS)

- Maintenance of current service levels with a plan to extend service hours with the addition of 2, 12 hours of service
- Investment in risk mitigation and protection, considering call growth and off-load delays



Strathmere Lodge

- Staffing and technological enhancements to support resident care quality
- Investment in Strathmere Lodge facility rehabilitations

Planning & Woodlots

 Addition of one planning staff to support County strategic outcomes as it pertains to increased growth and development

Middlesex County Library

 Strategic investments in programs and services that enhance and expand access to technology



Economic Development

 A new Middlesex County Tourism Tool to support regional economic development initiatives

Middlesex County Connect

 Additional funding secured from the province for enhancements to Middlesex County Connect

Administration

- Adjustment to non-tax revenues through increased interest income and third-party recoveries
- Modernization of corporate processes and workflows

- Middlesex County is in a very positive financial situation, specifically as it pertains to tax rates, reserves and use of debt. This is a credit to Middlesex County Council's strategic partnerships and approach and commitment to legislated and people-oriented services.
- The 2024 Budget does not utilize funds from the Tax Rate Stabilization Reserve



 In comparison, Middlesex County maintains one of the lowest upper-tier tax rates in Southwestern Ontario

Assessment Diversification

- Middlesex County has historically been reliant on residential assessment growth
- The property tax base was not meant to handle the types of services Counties fund
- The property tax base is not a growing source of revenue unlike those sources at both the federal and provincial levels
- The County continues to support initiatives towards multi-residential affordable development and employment land uses
