Procurement Services Update

Procurement at the County



- In early 2022 LXM Law LLP, through grant funding from the Province of Ontario Municipal Modernization Program recommended to Council the need and opportunity of creating a centralized Procurement Services department at the County which in the future could support the lower tier municipalities.
- Procurement Services Manager was hired in November 2022 to initially support the County and MLPS. Support has been also provided to some of the lower tier municipalities.
- The department has been functioning for almost two years with a new County Procurement By-Law passed in March 2024 by Council with the support of County Legal Services.

The Story So Far...



2023

- 28 Bids (County/MLPS)
- Total awarded amount: \$19.3M
- Focus on bid consolidation and increase term
- Education/refresher of purchasing authorities on processes and by-law
- By-law development
- Initial conversations with lower tier municipalities regarding support.

2024 YTD

- 27 Bids (County/MLPS)
- Total awarded amount: \$19.6M
- Finalization and passing of new by-law
- Begun reviewing bid documents
- Hiring of a Procurement Officer
- Process of initial support of lower tier municipalities has commenced.

What's Next?



- Further to LXM Law LLP's recommendations, a Procurement Officer was hired in July 2024 with the intention of providing procurement services to all lower tier municipalities once fully onboard.
- Some lower tiers municipalities have already been engaged to receive support. It is expected that all municipalities will be offered our services by early 2025.

 - Purchasing By-Law revisions and amendments
 - Educating
 - Bid templates
 - Online bidding
 - Contract templates
- Identifying common purchases
- A centralized vendor reference database
 - Streamlined performance reviews

- Shared contractor programs
