

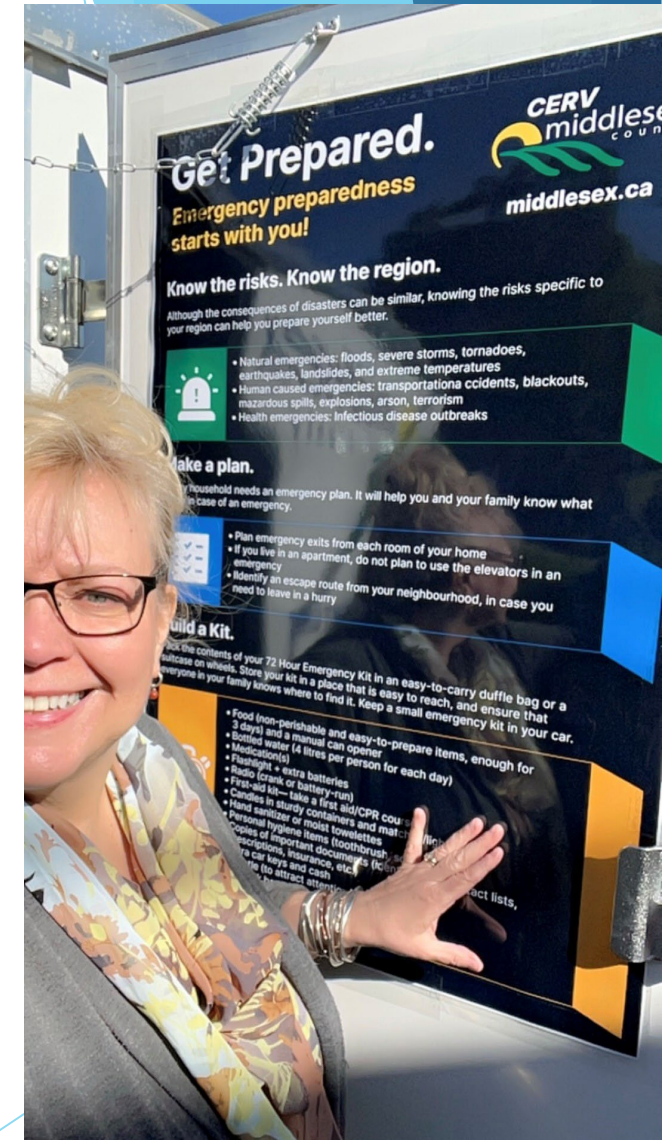

Emergency Management in Middlesex County:

- ▶ The CEMC and the municipal & County Emergency Management Program Committees are responsible for developing, implementing and maintaining proactive emergency management programs, which are geared towards prevention, preparedness, response and recovery from major emergencies that could have disastrous impacts on our communities



Responsibilities of the County CEMC:

- ▶ Development and implementation of Emergency Response Plans for the County of Middlesex & municipalities and maintenance of the emergency management program to meet provincial regulations & requirements
- ▶ Development of supporting plans for the dissemination of emergency information, including use of Ontario's 2-1-1 telephone info system
- ▶ Development and implementation of a public education programs for residents and school children
- ▶ Development and implementation of an annual emergency management exercise and emergency management training program, involving appropriate staff, volunteer organizations and emergency response partners
- ▶ Training, support & coordination of the CERV Middlesex Team

- ▶ Our training programs include:
 - ▶ Basic Emergency Management (BEM) through EMO
 - ▶ EOC Scribe Workshop
 - ▶ Registration & Inquiry Workshops
 - ▶ Intake Function (basic)
 - ▶ CRIB & Supervisor's Workshop (advanced)
 - ▶ Reception Centre Operations
 - ▶ Nonviolent Crisis Intervention (verbal de-escalation & personal safety skills) through CPI®
 - ▶ One hour Emergency Preparedness Workshops for students, businesses, service clubs, seniors & faith groups

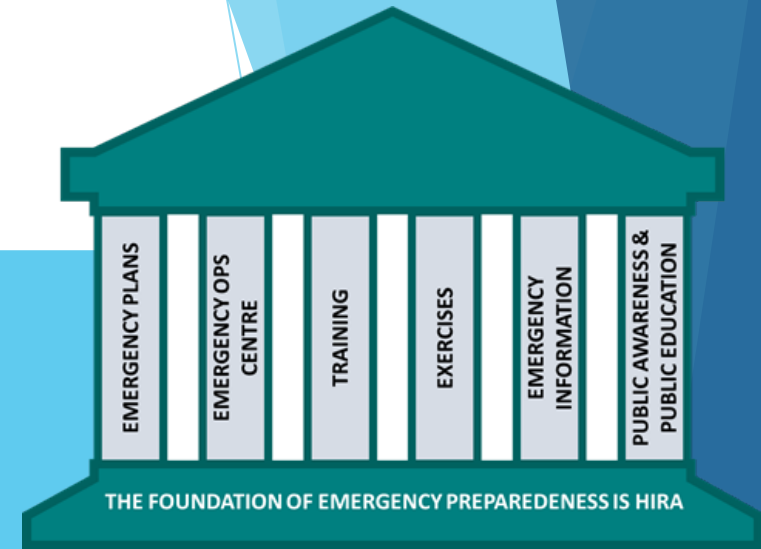
2) Basic Emergency Management Course (BEM, EM 200)

Recent Annual Emergency Exercises:

- ▶ **2021: Exercise “Cold Comfort”**

- ▶ Addressing additional concerns around operating a Reception Centre or Warming/Cooling Centre during the COVID pandemic

- ▶ **2022: Exercise “Cyber Attack”**

- ▶ Managing a computer hacking and ransomware incident

- ▶ **2023: Exercise “Tapped Out”**

- ▶ Possible loss of water supply from Lake Huron Water Supply System (Lake Huron) and/or the Tri-County Drinking Water System (Lake Erie)

- ▶ **2024: Field Exercises “Warm Welcome”**

- ▶ Four full scale exercises focusing on opening & operating Reception Centres in Middlesex County, involving municipal staff, CERV Middlesex volunteers, Middlesex County Library staff, The Salvation Army, Victim-Services Middlesex-London, MLHU Public Health Inspectors, MLPS Community Care Paramedics and local volunteers
